

### 2.1 Philosophy and Objectives of the Course

### 2.1.1 Philosophy

To produce researchers, developers and innovators who create knowledge and innovation in behavioral sciences for sustainable personal and social development.

### 2.1.2 Course Objectives

- 2) Able to disseminate behavioral science research results that are recognized both nationally and internationally.
- 3) Conduct research in applied behavioral science on the basis of research ethics appropriately.

- 1) ELO 1: Able to analyze and synthesize concepts, theories and research methodology for applying and building new knowledge in behavioral science as well as in the related disciplines.

The Ph.D. by research program focuses on doing research without course work. The dissertation credit is 48 credits (GRD 892). The number of credits that should be enrolled in each semester is shown in Table 1. The lowest number of credits are 6 and the most credits are 12 in each semester.
